BERLIN

Berlin, Germany's capital, dates to the 13th century. Reminders of the city's turbulent 20th-century history include its Holocaust memorial and the Berlin Wall's graffitied remains. Divided during the Cold War, its 18th-century Brandenburg Gate has become a symbol of reunification. REGISTRATION

All PGA participants are expected to **register at 9am on Monday June 3rd** prior to the opening ceremony. If you have not already paid online, the PGA Secretariat will collect your payment for the registration fee in cash (please have the exact amount). Those who have pre-registered and paid, you need to approach the registration desk to collect your conference kit.

The registration desk will be set up at FES.

WEATHER AND CLOTHING

In July in Berlin, the climate is wet (with 96mm of rainfall over 14 days). The weather's not getting better compared to the previous month since in June there is an average of 68mm of rainfall over 12 days.

The climate pleasant there the month of July. Temperatures are up to 27°C. The seasonal minimum is 17°C. Thus, the mean temperature average in July in Berlin is 22°C. Note that seasonal norms are in contrast with those observed in Berlin in July with a maximum record of 39°C in 2010 and a minimum record of 9°C in 2009. You can hope to have about 7 days with temperatures up to 30°C.

On average, in Berlin, the days of July last 16:21. The sun rises at 04:01 and sets at 20:22. With a good climate, the month of July is a good month to go in this city in Germany. Read more at here.

For the PGA casual clothing is most welcome. For the GFMD proceedings, semi-formal/professional attire is recommended.

INTERNET CONNECTION

The hotel and PGA venue are equipped with complementary wifi connections.

VISA INFORMATION

EU-Nationals

EU nationals do not require a visa to enter the Federal Republic of Germany.

Non-EU nationals

Generally speaking, all other foreigners require a visa for stays in Germany. A visa is not required for semi-annual visits of up to 90 days each for nationals of those countries for which the European Community has abolished the visa requirement.

CURRENCY

The German currency is the Euro. Currency Exchanges (Geldwechsel) - You can find currency exchange desks at any airport you arrive into, most train stations (Bahnhof) in larger towns and cities and all banks or you can use your ATM card at most ATM's in Germany. ATMs are known in German as Bankomat.
